



Selection Criteria for the 7th Lindau Meeting of the Laureates of the Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel

The Irish Research Council is pleased to announce the opening of the call for nominations of Irishbased researchers, working in the field of economic sciences, to attend the 7th Lindau Meeting of the Laureates of the Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel.

The meeting will be held from the 25th to the 29th August 2020 on the island of Lindau, situated on Lake Constance in southern Germany. The audience for the Laureates' lectures, panel discussions and special discussion sessions will be up to 500 economists, mostly postgraduate students but also some post-docs and young assistant professors. All nominated participants shall meet the following criteria:

- To count as young economists, applicants should be under 35 years of age, belong to the top of their class / cohort, and have strong recommendations from their academic advisor.
- Candidates should have a promising research agenda.
- Candidates should be actively interested in international dialogue within the academic community.
- Candidates should demonstrate fluency in the English language.
- Candidates should be willing to prepare themselves carefully for the Lindau meeting.
- (1) Postgraduate students should:
 - Have excellent academic records.
 - Have at least some research experience.
 - Have at least initial tutoring and / or teaching experience.
- (2) Postdoctoral students or early tenure-track scientists, should:
 - Be less than 5 years away from their PhD.
 - Have published outstanding papers in widely recognised academic journals.
 - Have presented their research at international conferences.
 - Have acquired solid experience in tutoring and / or teaching.

Letters of nomination should:

- Be one A4 page in length and submitted as a Pdf file;
- include a description of the candidate's achievements and **not** a description of the nominating institution;
- Be individual letters for each candidate and **not** a standard letter which is the same for all candidates;
- point out any specific accomplishments of the candidate in scientific and/or clinical work, or in raising public awareness of their research.

Please bear in mind the letter of recommendation is an important factor in the evaluation process and it does influence the results.
